Comparisons by Demographic Subgroups

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Summary

The National Citizen Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by number of years living in Dublin, whether or not children live in the household, annual household income and age.

Responses in the following tables show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as “excellent” or “good,” or the percent of respondents who attended a public meeting more than once a month. ANOVA and chi-square tests of significance were applied to these comparisons of survey questions. A “p-value” of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between subgroups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed are “real.” Where differences were statistically significant, they have been shaded grey.

The margin of error for this report is generally no greater than plus or minus four percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (780 completed surveys). For subgroups of responses, the margin of error increases because the sample size for the subgroup is smaller. For subgroups of approximately 100 respondents, the margin of error is plus or minus 10 percentage points.

Notable differences between demographic subgroups included the following:

- In the facet of Mobility, longer term residents gave higher ratings to overall ease of travel. They also tended to give higher ratings to traffic flow, as did residents with children living at home and those ages 35-54. Those living in Dublin between 6-10 years, those with children in the household and residents age 18-34 gave higher ratings for ease of public parking. Other community characteristics of Mobility (such as ease of walking) tended to garner higher ratings from those with children in the household. Longer term residents gave higher ratings for the Mobility services of traffic enforcement and snow removal, while households with children gave higher ratings for the services of street cleaning, sidewalk maintenance, traffic signal timing and bus or transit services.
- Younger, wealthier and newer residents were more likely to believe the economy would have a positive impact on their income in the next 6 months. Where differences were noted, ratings for a variety of community characteristics related to Economy (such as cost of living, shopping opportunities, overall economic health, etc.) varied across subgroups.
- Residents who have lived in Dublin longer than 11 years, are making more than \$150,000 annually and are 35 years or older gave higher ratings for the Natural Environment services of garbage collection, recycling and yard waste pick-up. Older and wealthier residents were also more likely to recycle than their counterparts.
- Those living in Dublin longer than 6 years, residents with children in the household, wealthier residents and those over the age of 35 all gave higher ratings for sense of community and were also more likely to remain in Dublin over the next five years.
