

**Chief's Comments:** September saw the largest number of thefts from vehicles so far this year (29). CIU investigators and detectives, however, were able to make five substantial arrests of suspects who have committed many times more of these crimes over the last several months.

Crashes, especially on the US Rt. 33 corridor continue to be an issue for us. Officers with our CIU Traffic Unit, as well as our Patrol officers have been focusing distracted driving enforcement efforts in this area, as well as our other top crash areas. We do not anticipate this trend to abate until after the upcoming construction is concluded.

# DIVISION ACTIVITY

## CALLS FOR SERVICE

### District 1

Includes all areas within the city limits that are south and east of Interstate 270 and west of the Scioto River. Also includes I270 northbound from US 33 westbound ramp up to Sawmill Road.

### District 2

Includes all areas within the city limits that are east of the Scioto River, west of Sawmill Road, south of the Delaware County Line and north of Martin Road. Also includes I270 westbound from Sawmill Road to US 33 and the ramp from I270 southbound to US 33 westbound.

### District 3

Includes all areas within the city limits that are north of Brand Road and west of the Scioto River. All addresses that are within the city limits on Brand Road including the intersections of Brand Road/Muirfield Drive and Brand Road/Dublin Road are covered by this district.


### District 4

This district includes all areas within the city limits that are south of Brand Road, north of US 33 and west of Interstate I270, Browning Court and Dublin Road. Addresses that are south of Brand Road to the I270 overpass that are within the city limits are part of District 4.

### District 5

This area includes all areas within the city limits that are south of the north edge of US 33 and west of I270. This area also covers both northbound and southbound lanes of I270 between Tuttle Crossing and US 33 and all ramps to and from I270 south of US 33.

**OTE:** The following is a breakdown of calls for service. They represent initial reports. The number of actual offenses may be different after officer's investigation.



# WORKLOAD ANALYSIS REPORT

July – September 2014

The July through September 2014 Workload Analysis reflects a total of 5,973 calls for service. This figure does not include traffic stops, foot patrols or courtesy cards initiated by officers or activity occurring in District 0 (calls outside city limits/mutual aid). The average response time for calls was five (5) minutes from the time the call was received by our communications technician until the first responding officer arrived on the scene. The average time to reach a disposition and clear the call was twenty-five (24) minutes.

The Workload Analysis also allows us to track activity levels by hour by day. We analyze this data to determine our staffing levels for patrol shifts. By reviewing our Workload Analysis Graph on the following page, you can see that our busiest hour of activity was between 10AM and 11AM. Four hundred seventy-five (475) calls for service were received during this time frame. The next busiest hour was between 4PM and 5PM when 421 calls for service were received. The ability to obtain this type of data is critical to effectively staff our patrol shifts.

While reviewing this report it is important to note that various factors can influence average response times. "Stacking" of calls where lower priority calls are held so that calls of a more urgent nature can be dispatched and responded to commonly occurs. "Cross dispatching" where an officer is dispatched out of district to a call will also increase response time. Low priority calls that are received during roll call/shift change negate an immediate response from patrol officers thus increasing response times.

As a matter of practice, we like to keep our average response time for all calls occurring inside the City under ten (10) minutes. As previously stated, there are certain incidents where that becomes impossible. However, our goal is realistic and as demonstrated by the July through September 2014 report, was met. The following is a breakdown of calls for service by district with the overall total calls, average response time and average time to resolve the call:



# WORKLOAD ANALYSIS REPORT

January – September 2014

The January through September 2014 Workload Analysis reflects a total of 16,972 calls for service. This figure does not include traffic stops, foot patrols or courtesy cards initiated by officers or activity occurring in District 0 (calls outside city limits/mutual aid). The average response time for calls was five (5) minutes from the time the call was received by our communications technician until the first responding officer arrived on the scene. The average time to reach a disposition and clear the call was twenty-four (24) minutes.

The Workload Analysis also allows us to track activity levels by hour by day. We analyze this data to determine our staffing levels for patrol shifts. By reviewing our Workload Analysis Graph on the following page, you can see that our busiest hour of activity was between 10AM and 11AM. One thousand three hundred eighty (1,380) calls for service were received during this time frame. The next busiest hour was between 4PM and 5PM when 1,187 calls for service were received. The ability to obtain this type of data is critical to effectively staff our patrol shifts.

While reviewing this report it is important to note that various factors can influence average response times. "Stacking" of calls where lower priority calls are held so that calls of a more urgent nature can be dispatched and responded to commonly occurs. "Cross dispatching" where an officer is dispatched out of district to a call will also increase response time. Low priority calls that are received during roll call/shift change negate an immediate response from patrol officers thus increasing response times.

As a matter of practice, we like to keep our average response time for all calls occurring inside the City under ten (10) minutes. As previously stated, there are certain incidents where that becomes impossible. However, our goal is realistic and as demonstrated by the January through September 2014 report, was met. 

# Calls for Service by Time of Day January - September 2014










**CALLS FOR SERVICE - FIRST SHIFT**

**JULY 1 - SEPTEMBER 30, 2014**










**CALLS FOR SERVICE - FIRST SHIFT

## ACCIDENT ANALYSIS July - September 2014

July 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014 there were 239 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 2.60 accidents/day. Compared to 2013, accidents increased 8.6% (2014 = 239; 2013 = 220).

Personal injury accidents (71) accounted for 29.7% of the total. Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 134 reports being filed (56.1%). Private property collisions accounted for 34 (14.2%) reports being filed.


District 2 experienced the majority of accidents (64 or 26.8%) followed by District 5 with 60 accidents (25.1%). There were 45 collisions in District 1 (18.8%), 15 collisions in District 3 (6.3%) and 55 collisions in District 4 (23.0%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Wednesday with 48 accidents (20.1%) reported. The second busiest day was Thursday with 45 accidents (18.8%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 21 (8.8%); Monday = 25 (10.5%); Tuesday = 41 (17.2%); Friday = 36 (15.1%); and Saturday = 23 (9.6%).

The most frequent contributing factor was Following Too Closely, which accounted for 80 or 33.5% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factors were None (37 or 15.5%) followed closely by Failure To Control accounting for 34 or 14.2% of the accidents for the reporting period. The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 5PM-6PM with 28 (11.7%) accidents.


Six (6) crashes were identified as having been alcohol related (2.5%). The drivers in these accidents were arrested and charged with OVI. One hundred seventy-six (176) citations were issued to at fault drivers as a result of their accidents (73.6%).



## ACCIDENT ANALYSIS January - September 2014

January 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014 there were 693 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 2.54 accidents/day. Compared to 2013, accidents increased 7.9% (2014 = 693; 2013 = 642).

Personal injury accidents (189) accounted for 27.3% of the total (3 fatalities). Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 413 reports being filed (59.6%). Private property collisions accounted for 91 (13.1%) reports being filed.


District 5 experienced the majority of accidents (175 or 25.3%) followed by District 2 with 173 accidents (25.0%). There were 151 collisions in District 1 (21.8%), 45 collisions in District 3 (6.5%) and in District 4, 149 accidents (21.5%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Thursday with 142 accidents (20.5%) reported. The next busiest day was Wednesday with 125 accidents (18.0%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 61 (8.8%); Monday = 101 (14.6%); Tuesday = 101 (14.6%); Friday = 109 (15.7%); and Saturday = 54 (7.8%).

The most frequent contributing factor was Following Too Closely, which accounted for 230 or 33.2% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factor was Failure To Control (107 or 36.5%). The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 5PM-6PM with 95 (13.7%) accidents.




