- 270SB to 33EB ramp OPEN
- 33WB to 270SB remains closed. Expected to open late 2016.
- Intermittent ramp and lane closures for duration of project
- Permanent paving to take place in 2017

S.R. 161/RIVERSIDE DRIVE ROUNDABOUT and RIVERSIDE DRIVE REALIGNMENT




S.R. 161/Riverside Dr. Roundabout and Realignment


Dublin Road South Shared-Use Path

- Construction began in mid-August




2017 TRANSPORTATION UPDATES

- Cosgray/161 Roundabout
- Library Street Network

North High Street Widening

- Retaining wall built this summer along east side of High Street
- Design wrapping up this fall
- Construction expected to begin early 2017



Pedestrian/Bike Bridge Over Scioto River

- Reviewing 60% plans
- Bidding anticipated in spring 2017

TRASH CANS – SCREEN GREEN

Dublin City Code Requires
Trash/Recycling Containers:

- Stored inside garage or accessory structure
- Located to the side or back of residence shielded by a natural landscape barrier
- 100% year-round opacity within 2 years




EDUCATION AND ENFORCEMENT

Comprehensive Sweep Begins November 1

- Written violation notice
- Re-inspection
- Legal action if not compliant

HOW WILL IT WORK?

- HOA leadership contact us
- Recreation Services staff will come and meet with your planning team to discuss options and interests
- We will develop a customized program plan for your neighborhood
- HOA notifies residents of the opportunities and City does targeted neighborhood notifications if necessary



IS IT JUST FOR OUR NEIGHBORHOOD?

- Yes!
- Our mobile recreation vehicle will bring you everything you need
- All you have to do is register and walk to your park to join us



Will there be a fee?

- There may be a fee depending upon the cost to provide the program. There also may be options for free program demos and programs that can be sponsored by the HOA.

How will I register?

- Online or at the DCRC in the same way you register for all of our programs. We will have specific program numbers for your neighborhood programs.



Will this interfere with open park use?

- No, these programs will share space with other park users and programs will be developed with neighborhood guidance.

Can I drop in if I see something fun going on as I pass by?

- Yes! If there is a fee, we'll help you get signed up after class.






THEFTS FROM VEHICLES AND BURGLARIES/B&E

KEEPING CRIME LOW IN DUBLIN

Theft Prevention



- 1) Remove valuables from your vehicles and lock your doors.
- 2) Park in a well lit area.
- 4) Keep an eye and ear out for suspicious or unusual activity.
- 5) Call the police immediately (911 or 614-889-1112) if you witness a crime or if you witness something suspicious.



Avoid Burglary



- 1) Keep your garage door closed in the evening and at night.
- 2) Lock your doors and windows when you are not home or when you are home for the evening.
- 3) If you have a residential alarm system, use it.
- 4) If you plan to be out of town for vacation, sign up for the vacation house watch program.
- 5) Keep an eye and ear out for suspicious or unusual activity.
- 6) Call the police immediately (911 or 614-889-1112) if you witness a crime or if you witness something suspicious.

ABOUT THE GRANT

- Established in 2011
- Provide funding assistance for high-quality, sustainable beautification projects
- 33 grants have been approved since the start of the program
- Projects include entry features enhancements, new signs and lighting, updated landscape beds, benches, removal of invasive species and art installation among others



PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- Projects must be clearly visible from the street
- Projects are required to be new or a rehab
- Grant awards are allowed up to \$5,000



PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- Repeat limitation
- Requires equal match from the Association
- Expense reimbursed upon successful completion of the project and conformance with all standards of the program



GETTING STARTED

- Application Form and Guide are available on the City website
- Staff is available to advise and assist
- All completed applications must be submitted by **Friday, January 6, 2017** for consideration in the next funding cycle
