Accomplishments

- Increased staffing to 74 authorized officers
- Lieutenants promoted to Deputy Chiefs
- Earned two-year \$310,000 wellness grant



Crime Update

- Record low of burglary and B&E offenses
- Added investigative analyst to agency
- Increase of theft from vehicle and theft of vehicle offenses
- Secured conviction after a four-year murder case went to trial, giving justice to local family
