1. Call to order/Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Noble called the May 16th, 2024 meeting of the Dublin Veterans Committee to order at 3:11 P.M. in person.

2. Roll Call

3. Review and approval of March 21, 2024 Minutes

Mr. Parkhill motioned to approve the March 21st, 2024 minutes, with a second from Mr. Hansley, the motion was unanimously approved.

4. Memorial Day Ceremony

Mr. Noble gave an update on this year's Memorial Day Ceremony, noting the speaker Amber Hudson Clark. The location is similar to past year's at the Dublin Cemetery, with a community picnic following the ceremony at Monterey Park.

Mr. Noble reminded everyone about Military Roundtable with Speaker Amber Hudson this coming Monday at 1:00 PM at the DCRC. Ms. Hudson is the founder of MASH Pantry, a service that helps Veterans and first responders. He commended the work Ms. Hudson does.

5. Veterans Appreciation Card Ticket Drawing

Ms. Blake highlighted the current benefits offered within the Veterans Appreciation Program. She also updated the Committee on the external outreach portion of the program and shared her conversation with Visit Dublin, noting that they are happy to partner with the Committee and reached out to their membership to ask who offers or would be willing to offer veteran discounts. There was a flood in responses, resulting in the creation of a Veterans Discount webpage on the Visit Dublin website. She added that Staff is working to incorporate a link to this page on the Dublinveterans.com website.

In terms of membership, Ms. Blake noted that there are currently 65 Veterans signed up for the program.
