Update Veterans Affairs

Kendel Blake referenced the legislative update document in the committee packet. Several veteran-related bills are currently in committee at the state and federal levels. Jeff Noble highlighted a renewed initiative to establish a State Veterans Retirement Home in Central Ohio. Director Buck Bramlish of the Franklin County Veterans Service Commission has connected with a state senator—believed to be Senator Bob Johnson—who has expressed enthusiastic support for the project. The senator acknowledged potential competition from Northeast Ohio, which is also seeking a facility, but indicated a willingness to move forward regardless. Funding for such a facility is split, with 1/3 from the State and 2/3 from the VA funding, but the current funding pipeline for these homes spans nearly a decade. Jeff Noble noted that while this development would take significant time, the senator's commitment represents an important step forward.

STAFF COMMENTS

Kendel Blake recognized outgoing members Stephen Dickman and Tim Hansley for their years of service, including their involvement in citywide veteran events. Bonnie Gamary, whose term ends in July, was also honored. New committee appointments will be announced June 2. All are invited to the Boards and Commissions reception that evening at 5:30 PM.

Jeff Noble also invited members to attend the annual Memorial Day presentation to City Council on Monday, May 19 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers.

ROUNDTABLE

Jan Rozanski shared his attendance at the Ohio Military Hall of Fame induction ceremony, highlighting the number and caliber of honorees. He noted that of the Ohio Military honored, three were Medal of Honor recipients, One Distinguished Service Cross recipient, six Silver Star recipients, two Legion of Merit recipients, six Bronze Stars, and one Navy Marine Achievement medal with Medal of Valor. His son, Alex Rozanski, a Lima Company veteran and City of Dublin alumnus, was among them.

John Reiner shared that his granddaughter gave a well-received speech to the entire West Point cadet corps—over 4,300 cadets—during a blood drive initiative.

Stephen Dickman reflected on his time with the committee. He expressed his gratitude for having been part of a productive and impactful group and noted his ongoing willingness to assist in a more informal capacity if needed.

Tim Hansley echoed Stephen's remarks, thanking the Committee for their engagement and pursuit of honoring the veterans of Dublin.

Bonnie Gamary acknowledged student-led efforts by the Purple Star Group to collect and preserve veterans' stories, encouraging members to submit their contact information to participate.

Jeff Noble expressed appreciation for the contributions of Stephen Dickman and Tim Hansley as they conclude their terms. He acknowledged Bonnie Gamary for being selected as Grand Marshall for the City's 2025 Independence Day Parade.
