Wildlife - Mammal Bite

Mammal bites MUST be reported to your local county health department. This is a state law.

ALL mammal bites (wild and domestic) should be washed and cleaned/flushed with soap and hot water **IMMEDIATELY** for 10+ minutes. Dog Parks

Pets are Welcome in All City Parks and Open Spaces

Animals may not run at large in our parks. All animals must always be under the owner's control. All pets must be securely leashed, kept in a vehicle or suitably caged. Animal owners also must pick up and properly dispose of any fecal matter left by their pets. It's not just courteous — it's the law!
