

# **Council Candidate Q&A Transparency Posting**

# **Posting No. 5**

To ensure transparency and provide equal access to information for all candidates, the City is posting the following question received from a candidate, along with the City's response. This information is shared exactly as provided so that all candidates have the same access to City resources and clarification.

## **QUESTION SUBMITTED:**

A resident expressed concern about increased traffic volume and vehicle speeds on a residential street that has become a common route for drivers traveling to and from a nearby commercial area. The resident noted safety worries due to children playing outside and school bus activity in the afternoons.

A question was asked whether the City could conduct a traffic volume study and consider speed management measures such as caution signage, crosswalk enhancements, or other visual traffic-calming improvements. Additionally, inquired about how to have the area added to the City's list for speed management review and potential mitigation tactics.

### **CITY RESPONSE:**

The City reviewed the concern through its **Speed Management Program**, which emphasizes data-driven, effective, and consistent safety strategies. Although the **Tactical Urbanism Pilot** was discontinued based on community feedback, the City remains focused on practical measures to enhance neighborhood safety.

Requests for "Children at Play" signs are common but no longer used, as research shows they do not impact driver behavior and may create a false sense of security. Instead, the City promotes evidence-based programs like Slow Down Dublin, which encourages safe driving through education and free awareness materials available at City Hall and the DCRC.

A recent speed study has already been conducted and provided results.
