Focus & Results

Goal #1: Enhance our readiness and demonstrate our ability to effectively respond to and successfully resolve critical incidents and/or major crimes

- Total Part I violent crimes reported YTD decreased from 2025 by 11.1% (2026=8; 2025=9)
- 17.3% increase in reported crimes YTD from 2025 (2026=325; 2025=277)
- Successfully responded to changing crime trends identified in the city

Goal #2: Reduce theft offenses throughout the city

- 11.4% decrease in theft offenses from 2025 YTD (2026=62; 2025=70)
- 11.5% decrease in thefts from vehicles from 2025 YTD (2026=23; 2025=26)
- 26.3% decrease in motor vehicle theft or attempts from 2025 YTD (2026=14; 2025=19)
- Increase in burglaries and B&Es from 2025 YTD (2026=14; 2025=10)

Goal #3: Improve overall traffic safety in the city

- 5.0% increase in traffic crashes from 2025 YTD (2026=168; 2025=160)
- Increase in serious injury traffic crashes from 2025 YTD (2026=4; 2025=2)
- Increase in OVI related traffic crashes from 2025 YTD (2026=8; 2025=2)
- 44.4% increase in OVI related arrests from 2025 YTD (2026=65; 2025=45)

Goal #4: Strengthen public trust through proactive and collaborative community outreach and engagement

- The Chief's Advisory Committee was established in 2020 by Resolution 41-20, comprised of 10 community members and personnel of the Dublin Police Department. The committee meets regularly working together to ensure transparency, accountability and consistent communication with the community.
- The department implemented a police intern program in January 2026. The selected candidate worked with the department on various projects throughout the course of their internship.

Goal #5: Enhance and demonstrate our ability to effectively address issues of significant community concern

- The department continues enforcement efforts throughout the city with traffic, noise and speeding concerns.
- The department worked with local partners to coordinate and host a mental health town hall. The town hall is planned for May 2026 to enhance mental health awareness and provide resources to the community.

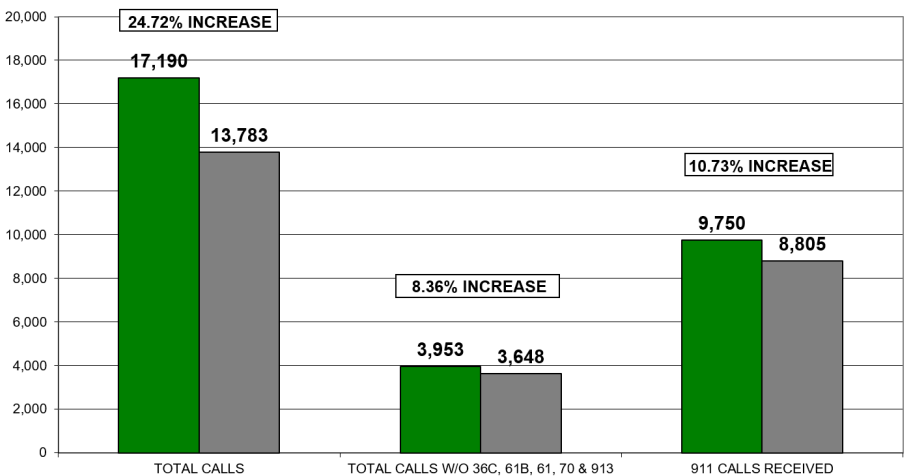

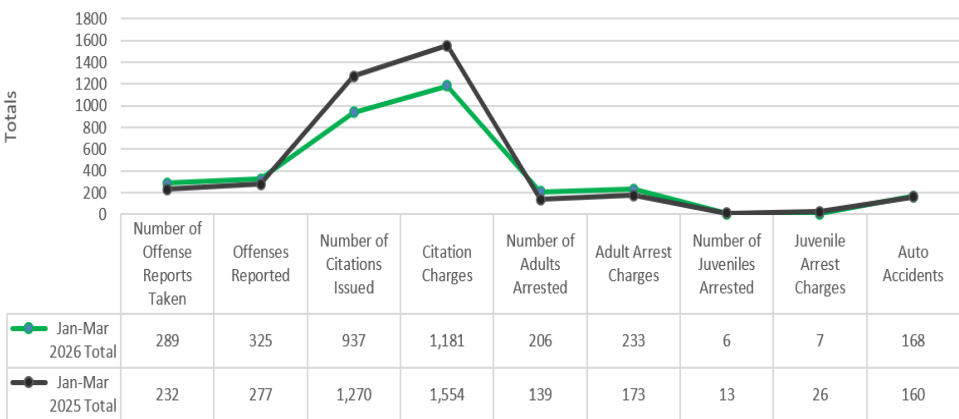

CALLS FOR SERVICE JANUARY 1, 2026 - MARCH 31, 2026

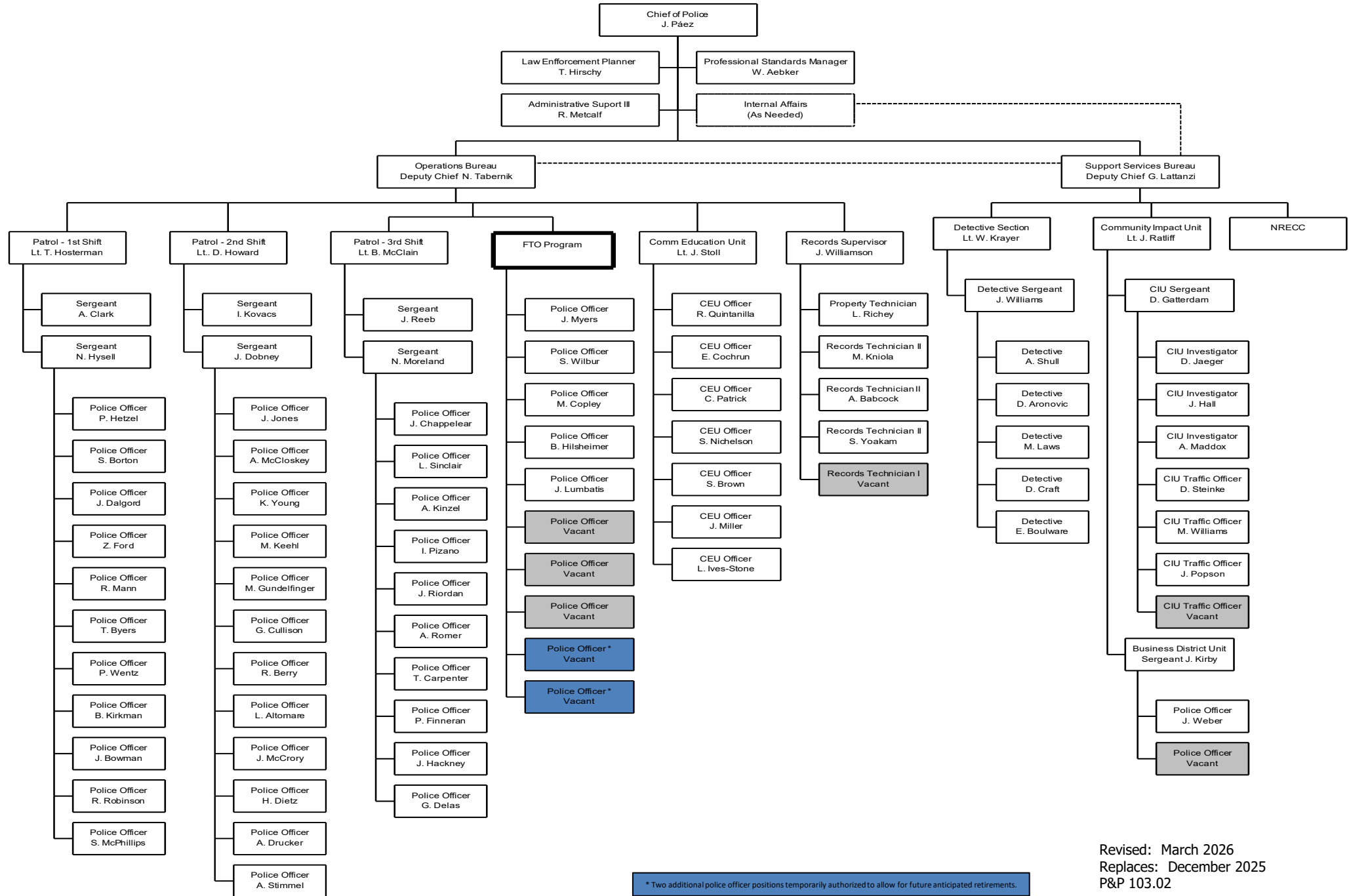

January - March 2026 Other Reported Activity



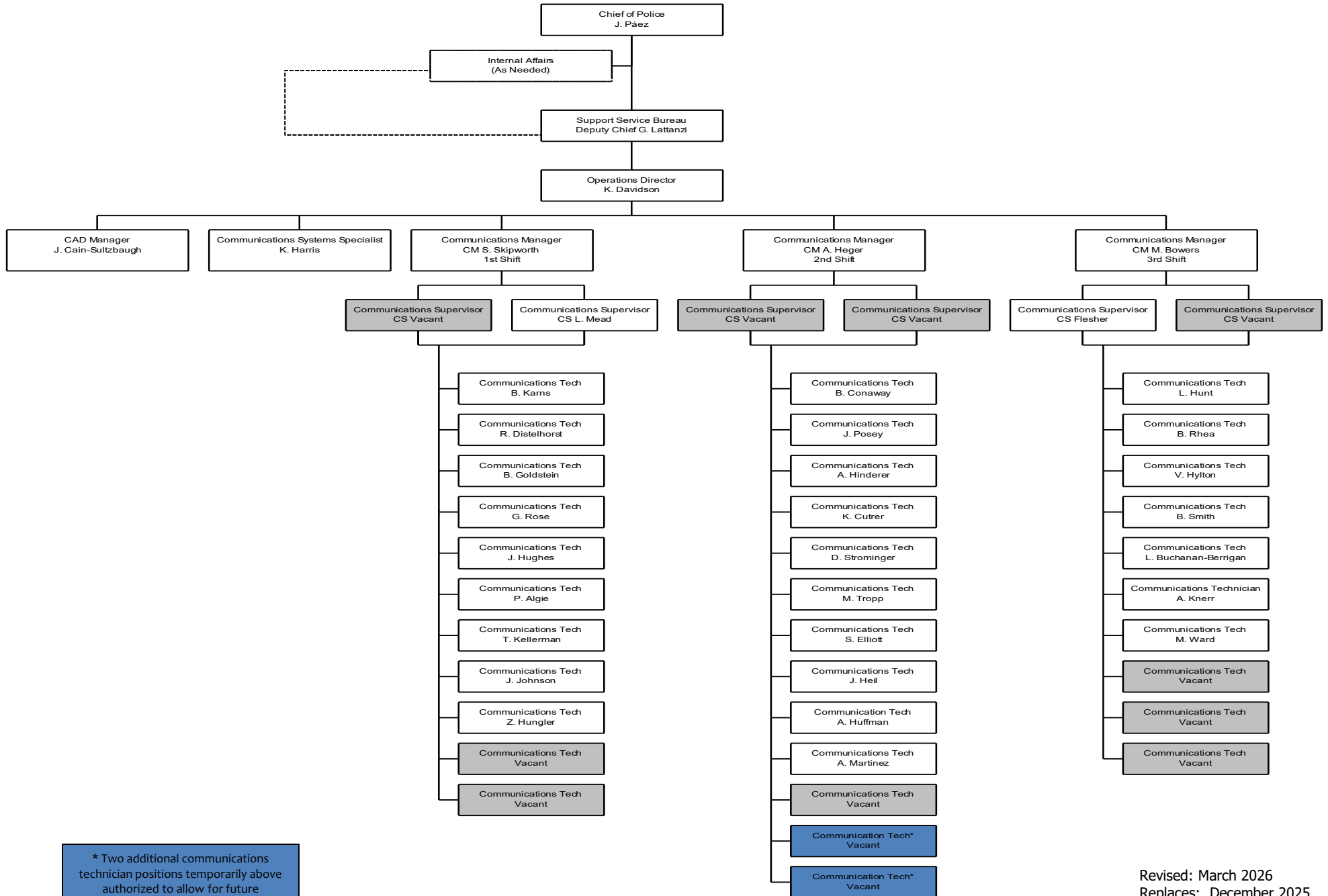
City of Dublin - Police Department - Organizational Chart - Standard 11.1.1

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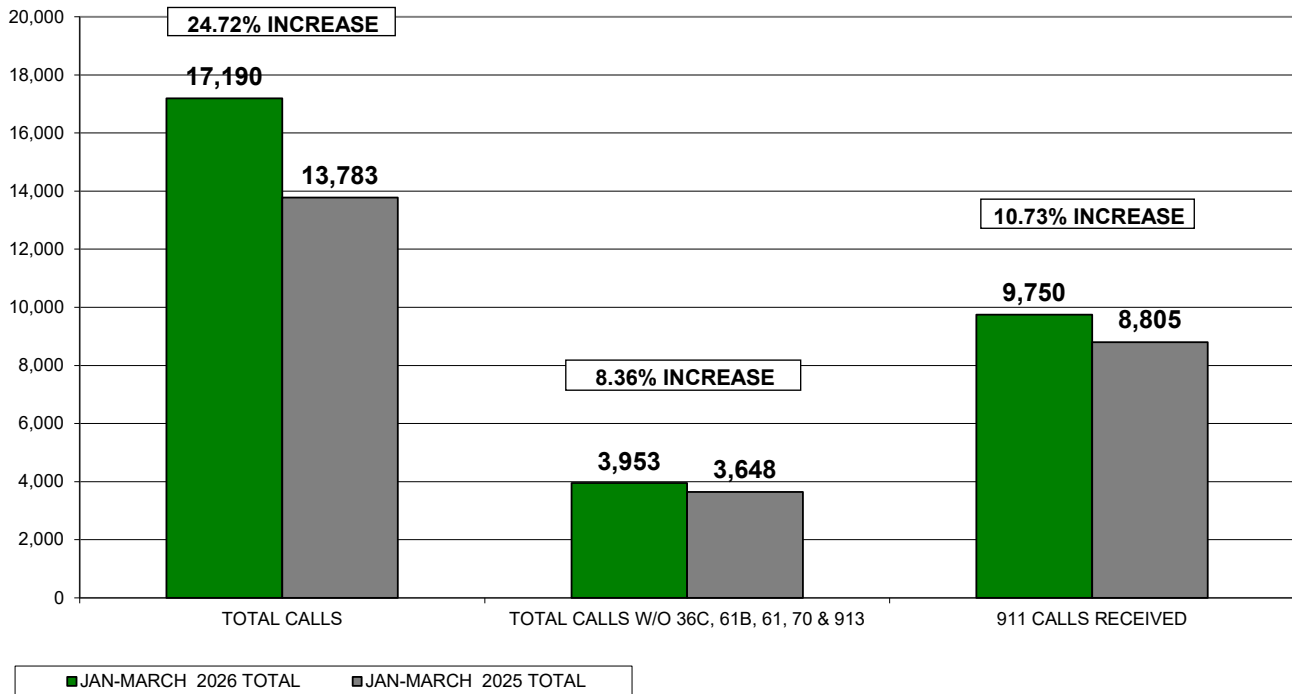

ACCIDENT ANALYSIS

January - March 2026

January 1, 2026 through March 31, 2026 there were 168 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 1.87 accidents/day. Compared to 2025, accidents increased 5.0% (2026 = 168; 2025 = 160).

Personal injury accidents (48) accounted for 28.6% of the total. Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 120 reports being filed (71.4%).

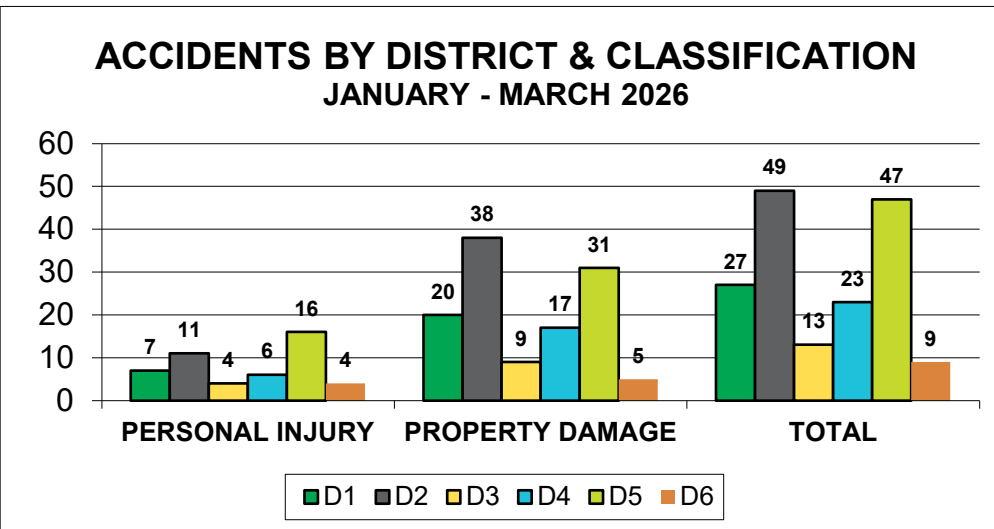
District 2 experienced the majority of accidents (49 or 29.2%) followed by District 5 with 47 accidents (28.0%). There were 27 collisions in District 1 (16.1%); 13 collisions in District 3 (7.7%); 23 collisions in District 4 (13.7%); and 9 collisions in District 6 (5.4%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Wednesday with 32 accidents (19.0%) reported. The second busiest day was Tuesday with 31 accidents (18.5%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 16 (9.5%); Monday = 18 (10.7%); Thursday = 27 (16.1%); Friday = 25 (14.9%); and Saturday = 19 (11.3%).

The most frequent contributing factor was Failure to Yield which accounted for 34 or 20.2% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factor was Following Too Closely accounting for 33 or 19.6% of the accidents for the reporting period. The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 2PM-3PM with 16 (9.5%) accidents.

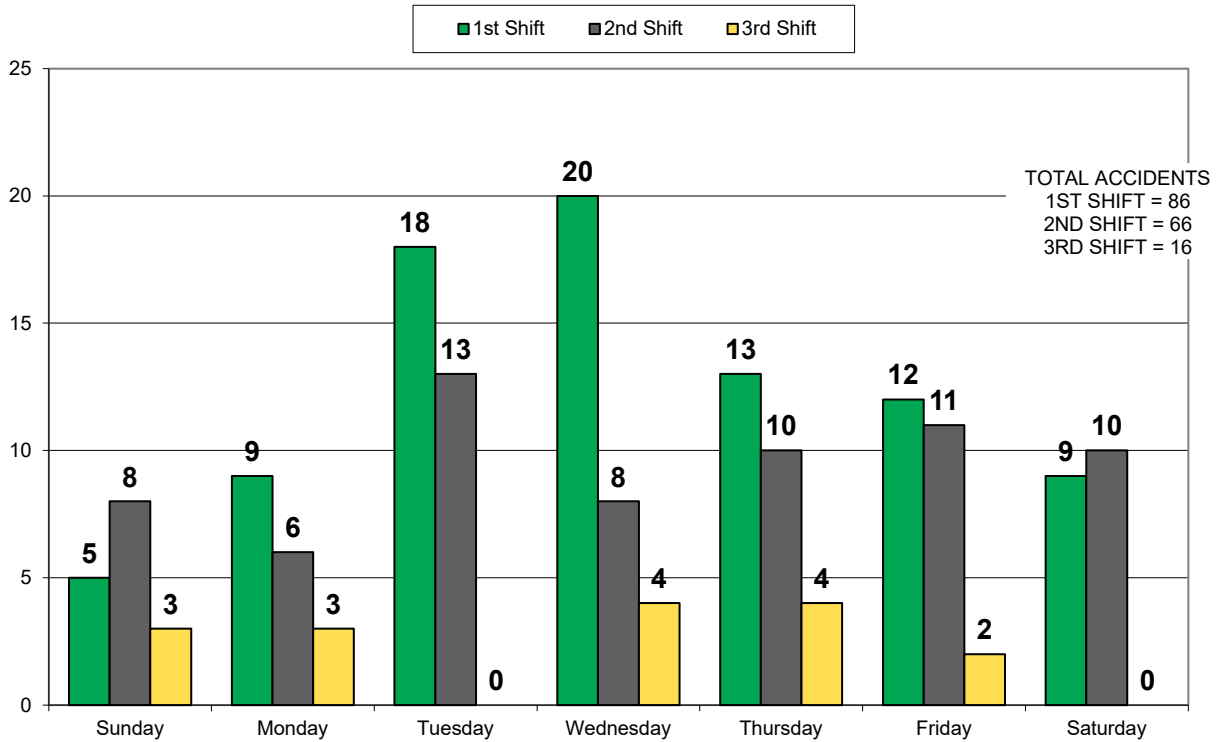
Eight (8) crashes were identified as having been alcohol related (4.8%). One hundred-thirty (130) citations were issued to at fault drivers as a result of their accidents 77.4%
