### Focus & Results

Goal #1: Enhance our readiness and demonstrate our ability to effectively respond to and successfully resolve critical incidents, major crimes, and/or issues of significant community concern.

- ➤ Violent crimes decreased from 14 in 2016 to 12 YTD for 2017; -14.3%
- ➤ 3.6% increase in reported crimes YTD from 2016

## Goal #2: Reduce theft offenses throughout the city.

- ➤ 12.6% increase in theft offenses from 2016 YTD
- ➤14.6% increase in thefts from vehicles from 2016 YTD
- ➤ 40.7% decrease in burglaries and B&Es from 2016 YTD

## Goal #3: Improve overall traffic safety in the city.

- ➤ 4.6% decrease in traffic crashes from 2016 YTD
- ➤ 3.7% increase in injury traffic crashes from 2016 YTD
- ➤ 10.0% increase in OVI related traffic crashes from 2016 YTD

#### Goal #4: Enhance and demonstrate our ability to effectively address drug offenses that contribute to crime affecting the city.




#### Calls for Service by District (w/o Officer Initiated Calls)



# Remove the **Risk**

## "Take-Back Tuesdays"

Dublin, Ohio) The City of Dublin is launching a new initiative in October to collect unused and expired prescription pills. Dublin Police will hold "Take-back Tuesday" events at various parks around Dublin to provide a convenient, safe way for residents to dispose of their medications.

Prescription pill abuse is a problem in communities

across the country, including ours, and it contributes to the growing opiate epidemic. By hosting these take-back events, the City hopes to help residents remove the risk of having highly addictive opiates in their homes.

"Unused prescription medications can pose a problem," says Mayor Greg Peterson. "People often forget that they still have them on hand. By getting rid of old medications, they reduce the risk of the pills getting into the wrong hands."

The first Take-back Tuesday will be held Tuesday, October 17 from 6 - 7:30 p.m. at Kaltenbach Park, located at 5985 Cara Road. Residents are invited to bring their unused medications and come talk to Dublin Police personnel about the dangers of opiate abuse.

"We want residents to clean out their medicine cabinets, and bring all those old pill bottles with unused medications to these events. We'll have trained police officers on hand to collect the pills and make sure they are disposed of properly," says Dublin Police Chief Heinz von Eckartsberg. "Even if you don't have unused medications in your home, come on out to one of these events to learn more about the ongoing opiate crisis and how it affects all of us."

The City plans to host these events Tuesdays in October, leading up to National Pill Take-back Day on Saturday, October 28, 2017. Dublin Police will be collecting pills from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. at the City parking lot located at 6670 Commerce Parkway.

#### The schedule is as follows:

- •Tuesday, October 17 (6 7:30 p.m.) Kaltenbach Park, 5985 Cara Road
- •Tuesday, October 24, (6 7:30 p.m.) Scioto Park, 7377 Riverside Drive

In addition to Take-back Tuesdays and National Pill Take-back day, a prescription pill drop box is available at the Dublin Justice Center 24/7 for pill disposal.






#### CALLS FOR SERVICE

A Neighborhood Watch group is an association of neighbors who look out for each other's families and property, alert the police to any suspicious activities and work together to make their community a safer place to live.



Here are a few extra steps you can take to start organizing your Neighborhood Watch group:

- •Host a neighborhood meeting to gauge neighbors' interest and begin to identify neighborhood issues that need to be addressed.
- •Invite a Dublin Police Officer to attend this meeting to discuss details of the program and answer any questions.
- •Select block captain volunteers who will be responsible for relaying information to members on their block, keeping up-to-date information and making efforts to involve everyone.
- •Elect a chairperson to serve as liaison with the Division of Police and relay information about meetings and crime incidents to block captains.
- •Establish a regular means of communicating with Watch members





# ACCIDENT ANALYSIS July - September 2017

July 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 there were 238 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 2.59 accidents/day. Compared to 2016, accidents decreased 5.93% (2017 = 238; 2016 = 253).

Personal injury accidents (84) accounted for 35.3% of the total. Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 154 reports being filed (64.7%).


District 2 experienced the majority of accidents (78 or 32.8%) followed by District 5 with 63 accidents (26.5%). There were 41 collisions each in District 1 (17.2%), 13 collisions in District 3 (5.5%) and 43 collisions in District 4 (18.1%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Thursday with 53 accidents (22.3%) reported. The second busiest day was Wednesday with 38 accidents (16.0%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 21 (8.8%); Monday = 22 (9.2%); Tuesday = 36 (15.1%); Friday = 33 (13.9%); and Saturday = 35 (14.7%).

The most frequent contributing factor was Following Too Closely, which accounted for 78 or 31.6% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factor was Failure To Yield accounting for 52 or 21.1% of the accidents for the reporting period. The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 5PM-6PM with 25 (10.1%) accidents.


Eight (8) crashes were identified as having been alcohol related (3.9%). The drivers in these accidents were arrested and charged with OVI. Two hundred seventeen (217) citations were issued to at fault drivers as a result of their accidents (87.9%).



# ACCIDENT ANALYSIS January - September 2017

January 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 there were 666 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 2.44 accidents/day. Compared to 2016, accidents decreased 3.98% (2017 = 666; 2016 = 698).

Personal injury accidents (199) accounted for 29.9% of the total (2 fatalities). Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 467 reports being filed (70.1%).


District 2 experienced the majority of accidents (252 or 37.8%) followed by District 5 with 162 accidents (24.3%). There were 110 collisions in District 1 (16.5%), 36 collisions in District 3 (5.4%) and in District 4, 106 accidents (15.9%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Friday with 121 accidents (18.2%) reported. The next busiest day was Wednesday with 117 accidents (17.6%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 60 (9.0%); Monday = 83 (12.5%); Tuesday = 94 (14.1%); Thursday = 111 (16.7%); and Saturday = 80 (12.0%).

The most frequent contributing factor was Following Too Closely, which accounted for 187 or 28.1% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factor was Failure To Yield (177 or 26.6%) followed by Failure To Control accounting for 88 or 13.2% of the accidents for the reporting period. The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 4PM-5PM with 78 (11.7%) accidents.


