Re: Resolution No. 08-17 - Rings Road Shared-Use Path Bid Acceptance

Summary

On January 25, 2017, six (6) bids were received, publicly opened and read by Engineering staff for the Rings Road Shared-Use Path project. This project involves the construction of 2,000 feet of 8-foot wide, shared-use path, and concrete combination curb and gutter the south side of Rings Road between Frantz Road and Dublin Road.

The project is scheduled to be complete by June 30, 2017. During construction, traffic will be reduced to one-lane, two-way operation between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. To keep the residents informed during this project, Engineering staff will be communicating through Community Relations and making information available on the City of Dublin website in addition to communicating directly with property owners directly adjacent to the project. The City will have a designated Engineering Project Inspector assigned to this project, who will oversee the contractor throughout the project. For Council's reference, a reduced set of project construction drawings has been placed in the Council Planning Room.

The Engineer's estimate for this project is \$430,000. The 2017-2021 Capital Improvement Program (ET16G) budgets funds of \$460,000 for this project.

Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. submitted the lowest and best bid of \$377,552.52. A summary of the bids received is provided below.

Recommendation

Staff has thoroughly reviewed the bid from Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. has not performed previous work for the City of Dublin, but was recently awarded the Smiley Park Shared-Use Path and Discovery Boulevard/Wall Street Shared-Use Path projects. They are Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) pre-qualified for roadway construction and have performed roadway and/or shared-use path construction projects in the last five years for ODOT, Upper Arlington, Orange Township, Groveport, Marion and Columbus. Staff has contacted their references, and the feedback regarding the quality of their work has been favorable.

Staff recommends Council approval of Resolution 08-17 accepting as lowest and best the bid of Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. in the amount of \$377,552.52 and authorizing the City Manager to enter into a contract with Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. for this project.

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE LOWEST AND BEST BID FOR THE RINGS ROAD SHARED-USE PATH PROJECT

WHEREAS, formal advertising and competitive bidding procedures have been conducted, pursuant to Section 8.04 of the Revised Charter and Chapter 37 of the Dublin Code, for the Rings Road Shared-Use Path Project; and

WHEREAS, Council has determined that the bid submitted by Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. constitutes the lowest and best bid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Dublin, State of Ohio, _____ of its elected members concurring, that:

Section 1. The bid submitted by Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. in the total amount of \$377,552.52 is hereby accepted.

Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into contracts with Park Enterprise Construction Company, Inc. for performance and completion of the Rings Road Shared-Use Path Project pursuant to the Advertisement, Proposal and Contract Documents for said project on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Section 3. This Council further hereby authorizes and directs the City Manager, the Director of Law, the Director of Finance, the Clerk of Council, or other appropriate officers of the City to prepare and sign all other agreements and instruments and to take any other actions as may be necessary to implement this Ordinance and complete the Project.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect upon passage in accordance with Section 4.04(a) of the Revised Charter.
