In coming to Dublin, our goal is to bring an active entertainment space with live music and an active night life, our Madery concept (incubator and market for local makers and social enterprises that employ those in need), coworking, private office, community event space, our local investor club that funds new businesses (makers, small business, and many others), and a lot more.




